### DIY ANIMAL PLASTIC BOTTLE PLANTER OR BOWL

- Paint the bottle the color of your choice.
- Use parts of the rest of the bottle to cut out ears and attach them to the top of the opening.


# WHAT'S INSIDE THIS ISSUE?

#### **SAY NO TO SINGLE-USE PLASTICS**

Not only do they clog our landfills and oceans - mostly because there are so many of them and they can sometimes take hundreds of years before they start to break down - but single-use plastics cost you more money too. # **PAPER OR PLASTIC?**
