COOL SNOW & WINTER FACTS!





No Two Snowflakes Are Exactly Alike!

Every snowflake has a unique shape. They all form in different ways, which is why no two look the same—even though they might seem similar!

A Snowflake Can Have Six Sides

Snowflakes often have six arms, or points, but each one looks a little different. This happens because of the way water molecules join together when freezing.

The Largest Snowflake Ever Recorded Was 15 Inches Wide!

The largest snowflake ever recorded fell in Fort Keogh, Montana in 1887! It was 15 inches across—about the size of a dinner plate!

Winter is a Great Time for Animal Tracks

When it snows, it's much easier to see animal tracks in the snow. If you're lucky, you might spot tracks from animals like deer, rabbits, or even foxes!

Snow is a Natural Insulator!

Snow actually helps insulate the ground. It keeps the soil underneath it warm enough for plants and animals to survive the freezing winter temperatures.





SNOWMAN CUPCAKES

Celebrate the snow and turn box cake mix into a wintry dessert with some marshmallows, chocolate and peppermint candy!

Ingredients:

- 1 box white cake mix (plus box ingredients)
- 2 sticks (8 oz) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 4 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1 pinch fine salt
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 tbsps milk
- 1/4 cup semisweet chocolate chips
- 12 large marshmallows
- 12 chocolate-covered peppermint candies

Directions:

- 1. Bake cupcakes according to the box and let cool.
- 2. Combine butter, sugar and salt in the bowl of a stand mixer with paddle attachment (or in a large bowl with a handheld mixer). Mix on low until mostly incorporated. Add vanilla, increase speed to medium-high and mix until smooth.
- 3. Fit a large pastry bag with a 1/3-inch diameter plain round tip (or snip the tip of a large resealable plastic bag), and fill with icing. Hold bag over the center of each cupcake and pipe a mound of icing without lifting the bag so icing spreads to the edges. Then lift slightly and pipe another mound on top.
- 4. Fit a small pastry bag with a small plain pastry tip (or snip the tip of a small resealable plastic bag). Microwave chocolate chips, stirring every 20 seconds, until just melted. Fill the prepared bag and pipe small dots for the eyes and the smile on one flat side of each marshmallow.
- 5. Pipe a bit of frosting on top of the marshmallow to glue on the chocolate peppermint candy, then place a dot of chocolate on top to form a button. Place marshmallow "head" on the center of each mound of icing.
- 6. Pipe chocolate dots for buttons and pipe arms from the shoulders.
