

#### WHEN TO KEEP SAVING AND WHEN TO BORROW

In most cases, it's good to wait to buy something until you have enough money saved up. But there are times when you need to buy something and it costs a lot, so borrowing the money makes more sense.

For example, most people borrow money for big things, like cars or houses. They cost a lot and it would take too long to save your money to buy them. But you need a car to get around and a house to live in. In cases like that, you can borrow the money from the bank!

## WHAT HAPPENS TO YOUR MONEY AFTER YOU DEPOSIT IT AT THE BANK?
